HIS 582 - TEACHING PRACTICUM

This course is designed for those preparing to teach students-especially at the post-secondary level-about the past and its contemporary relevance. We'll explore a wide range of issues related to pedagogy, and important professional and personal skills for today's educators in an everchanging political and digital landscape. Topics will include teaching strategies for lectures and seminars; grading; effective classroom management; innovative pedagogical approaches; new educational technologies; and resources to support students' learning and well-being. In addition, we'll reflect on some of the opportunities and challenges in teaching history for today's educators. Course requirements include mandatory attendance, required readings, active participation in class discussions, short writing assignments, developing a sample syllabus and teaching statement (as part of a teaching portfolio), and teaching a practice class. **History PhD students only.**
