

Arts & Sciences Senate Meeting Minutes March 21, 2022 3:30PM - 5:00PM Virtual Meeting

- Call To Order at 3:30pm.
- Acceptance of the <u>Agenda</u> The motion to accept the agenda is carried.
- Approval of February 14, 2022 Meeting <u>Minutes</u> The approval of the minutes is carried.
- Opening Remarks & Welcome (J. Torre):
 - We are going through Senate files and documents before the University Senate moves to the new location in Wang center. We are archiving documents to become accessible online.
- Revised FRRPC Resolution (F. Walter, Chair):
 - Presented the revised resolution as requested at the previous Senate meeting. In
 order to maximize participation, departments are encouraged to offer all
 otherwise in-person departmental faculty meetings and colloquia/seminars in
 hybrid mode, with remote accessibility via Zoom or equivalent.
 - The resolution was amended and approved.
 - Poll: 75% Accepted.
- Report of the Committee on Academic Standing and Appeals (R. Klein, Chair):
 - Postponed to the next meeting as R. Klien couldn't attend the meeting.
- Academic Freedom Resolution (K. Lindblom):
 - Addressed the restricted academic freedom in secondary and primary schools. The relevance was stated as feeding those same biases into institutions of higher education.
 - Presented a resolution resembling a resolution from the University of Texas at Austin.
 - J. Sanders offered an amendment to include a sentence to include K-12 libraries and schools.
 - Resolution amended and approved.
 - Poll: 69% Accepted.

- 2022 Proposed Promotion & Tenure Guidelines Revision (1st Reading) presented by J. Torre:
 - Explained the proposed changes made on the guidelines (1st reading) and received feedback from senators.
 - A document will be sent to all members for an open comment period and comments will be considered and incorporated as appropriate for the 2nd reading at the next (April) meeting.
 - There will be a 3rd reading at the May meeting.
 - The Provost's office will simultaneously be providing their suggestions.

 - A panel of experts will come together to discuss the war in Ukraine with the Stony Brook University community.
